## NEW SHELTER UPDATE 2017 Targeted to Move the Animals into Their New Home!

Everyone – including and especially us – cannot wait for the day we consolidate our operations and vacate the old shelter. We are so very anxious to move the animals to their new home and into a quality shelter that will serve the community and the animals for many years to come. And, it

is looking like that day could very well happen before the end of next year if all goes as hoped and planned in achieving our fundraising goals. We continue to have amazing campaign progress and momentum to report.

We have reached ~72% of our overall River's Edge Campaign goal of 2.6 million dollars. We need approximately \$320,000 to complete the fourth and final phase of the new shelter construction. We have been able to phase construction according to the funds we've had available. All the construction up until now could be broken into small phases. Currently, we have a fully enclosed Morton Building with all doors and windows installed. The floor piping has been laid and the concrete slab poured. Duct work, furnaces, an air exchange system and insulation have been installed. Wall studs and block walls are in place. With the exception of the final topcoat of blacktop (which is scheduled to be completed next week), the exterior site work and landscaping are complete.

The final phase of construction is the interior finishing work. Because this phase is totally integrated, we are unable to phase it. It has to be done in one stage of work. The total cost to complete the work is ~ \$752,000. \$432,000 toward this phase has already been raised and committed, leaving us with approximately \$320,000 more to fundraise to complete this last

stage of construction and move into the new shelter. The campaign will continue after the new shelter is built and we have moved all the animals into it so that we can then pay off the mortgage on River's Edge Farm and build endowment funds.

While significant resources are still needed, we are definitely seeing a very bright light at the end of this tunnel-and we are brimming with anticipation and elation for our animal friends. Over this past year, with the amazing support of our community and thanks to the generous donations from grant funders and individuals, we were able to raise over \$250,000 toward the project. So, we believe bridging the \$320,000 gap in this upcoming year with everyone pulling (continued)

together is going to be totally doable. We still have members in our community to talk with for additional large gifts and naming opportunities in support of this project, a solid grant application submitted for a matching funds request (which we anticipate hearing from before the end of this year), and the community portion of our campaign for other commemorative naming opportunities for smaller gifts to be developed and shortly implemented. We are continuing to look into other opportunities for grant funds as well. We have also added hands to share the work load and welcome two new board members, Nancy Latour and Michael Hopkins.

Additionally, *Willy of the Crooked Lake*, the children's book written by Gary Brown and illustrated by Brooke Mitchell, has helped us to raise over \$25,000 for the building project within just a year's time. The book and the status of the new shelter project were featured in the July/August issue of *Life in the Finger Lakes*. If you haven't seen this article, I would encourage you to check it out (article link: <http://www.lifeinthefingerlakes.com/willys-legacy/>). Being featured in this magazine has provided our project and funding efforts with more reach and exposure. We initially printed 1,000 books and recently did a reprint because the first printing was so successful. The book is licensed to the FLSPCA. A donation of \$15.00 or more is required to receive the book. All proceeds benefit the shelter's building project. We (and especially Gary Brown, the author of the book) are planning to continue with the aggressive promotion and distribution of this book to support our project and will continue to keep the project in the eye of the public.

Again, we cannot thank everyone enough for all their support, generosity and compassion in helping us to speak for those who cannot speak for themselves. And, on a personal level, I'm deeply humbled, honored and inspired to see all the progress and goodness that exists in support of this important project and because of the special connection we feel with our animal friends. Please keep watching for additional updates.

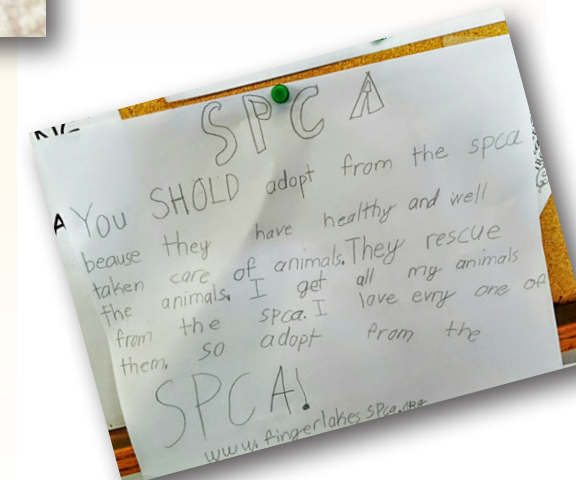

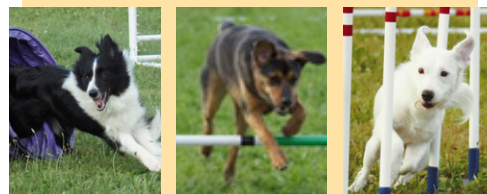

## VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT



### Dot Thomas

Dot Thomas was born at the Thomas Homestead outside of Campbell, New York. Her family consisted of her parents, 4 sisters and 3 brothers. Dot's husband was a military man; consequently they made several moves over the years. The Air Force took them to Kentucky and Texas, with short visits to Florida, after which they returned to the Corning area with their three daughters, Shiela, Kim and Brenda, and to employment with Corning Glass. Six years later, her husband became employed in Rochester. The family relocated to Victor, where the girls became students and ultimately graduates of Victor Central.

In 1982, after her family "left the nest", Dot purchased the Thomas Homestead from her parents and moved back to this area. Shortly after relocating, she returned to employment at Corning Inc. as a building project coordinator. A few of the many projects she has worked on include the Headquarter Building Phases 1 & 2; Corning Museum of Glass Phases 1, 2, & 3; Contemporary Art Glass Gallery; and a new 4-story building at Sullivan Park. As a result of her experience with Corning Inc., Dot was interested in and became involved with FLSPCA's new shelter construction committee.

Dot has volunteered with the FLSPCA for 8 years in several capacities. She began with exterior property management at the River's Edge Farm. Shortly thereafter, she introduced the idea of an on-site shop to generate funds for the care of the animals. Since then The Shoppe has blossomed into a well-received, successful endeavor. Three rooms in the farmhouse are stocked with donations from the public, including antiques, an array of collectibles, china, jewelry, seasonal accents, linens and new animal accessories. All these items are presented in an appealing way for sale to the public. All money from The Shoppe sales are allocated to the care of the FLSPCA animals.

When asked what is memorable to her about the FLSPCA, she says she has met so many people that are extremely dedicated to the cause of caring for animals and funding for their care. Dot says it is inspirational to her and puts her in awe to watch the volunteers, staff and executive director as they give so much of their personal life to the care of clients and the animals on a daily basis. She is one of those wonderful volunteers herself but is too humble to see it that way. We at the FLSPCA are encouraged by her kindness, warmth and dedication and feel very fortunate to have her as a friend and colleague.

Advice to interested people: Dot relates that there are dozens of jobs at the shelter for volunteers to be involved in. It is an organization with a wide range of tasks that need to be done for the program to run smoothly: Everyone has a gift to give and there is something for everyone to do.
